2009-2010 Registration Materials

As you examine this packet you will find:

- **One Registration and Emergency Information Form per child**
Please review the preprinted information on your child's form. If any of the information needs to be changed or additions added, please make those changes or additions directly on your child's form. Once all information has been verified for accuracy, **signature of parent or guardian, along with date is required** on each child's form. To ensure your child's proper placement on next year's class schedule **please return all registration/emergency forms to any school by May 29, 2009.**
- **One Registration Calculation Sheet per family**
Please verify that the preprinted information on this form is accurate. All corrections are to be made directly on your preprinted form. Indicate the total number of students to the appropriate grade level to calculate your total school fees. **All Calculation Sheets along with payment are to be returned by August 1, 2009.** Fees not received by August 1, 2009 will incur a \$25.00 late fee. Three attempts will be made to collect all unpaid balances. After the third attempt, unpaid balances will be sent to collections.

Student ID Numbers

Please make note of your child's ID number. Student ID numbers are located on each Registration/Emergency Information Form and Calculation Sheet. These ID numbers will be needed for online payments for student lunches and school fees.

Free and Reduced Fees

Anyone applying for free or reduced fees must complete the Illinois Free/Reduced Lunch Application, our Waiver of School Fees form and provide confirmation of current income. Confirmation of current income includes current pay stubs, award letters from welfare departments; food stamp/TANF letter of eligibility; Social Security retirement benefit/letter, or support payment decrees from court. **If you currently receive free or reduced school fees, you will be required to submit a new application and waiver along with confirmation of income for the 2009–2010 school year. These forms will be available in July/August.** All applications are verified by the Business Office before school fees are waived.

Certificate of Child Health/Dental/Eye Examinations

The Illinois School Code has been revised for the 2009-2010 School Year requiring the following health examinations. Please note: The only forms accepted by the State of Illinois for these requirements are available at all schools, Administration Center, District website, and Edline. All health forms are to be completed and turned into your child's school no later than two weeks before the first day of school; incomplete forms will be returned to parents/guardians.

- **Certificate of Child Health Examination (school physical):** Required for all students entering Kindergarten and 6th Grade.
NOTE: No longer a requirement for students entering 5th Grade
- **All 5th Grade students** must show written proof of having had all three Hepatitis B immunizations, and a minimum of one Varicella (chickenpox) vaccine or a doctor's written verification of having had the chickenpox disease.
- **Dental Examination:** Required for all students entering Kindergarten, 2nd and 6th Grade
- **Eye Examination:** In compliance with Illinois Public Act 095-0671, effective January 1, 2008, all students entering Kindergarten or any student entering a public school for the first time shall present proof of having been examined by a licensed physician or optometrist.

Thank you for your assistance with this important process. Please call any of our schools or the Administration Center should you need assistance with registration.

Parent/Guardian Notification of Criminal Offender Notification Laws

According to the Sex Offender Community Notification Law, 730 ILCS 152/101 et seq., as amended by P.A. 94-994, eff. 1/1/07, School Districts are required to notify parents/guardians of the availability of information regarding individuals convicted of serious crimes residing in their districts. Information regarding convicted sex offenders and child murderers is available to the public through the Statewide Sex Offender Database (a.k.a. Sex Offender Registry) www.isp.state.il.us/sor.

Board policies dealing with Criminal Offender Notification Laws include: 4:170 (Safety), 5:30 (Hiring Process and Criteria), 6:250 (Community Resource Persons and Volunteers), and 8:30 (Visitors to and Conduct on School Property).
